## NCC ARMY - ANNUAL REPORT 2018-19

The NCC was established on 16th July 1948 with a vision to mould the youth as responsible citizens of India by imbibing characters of discipline, leadership, spirit of adventure, selfless service to the nation, to take up leadership in all walks of life and to motivate the youth to take up a career in the armed forces.

The training commenced with the enrolment of the cadets on 7 July, 2018. A total of 108 cadets were recruited this year and Regular parades began with warm-ups, heavy drill, loud commands, theory classes and of course 'the fun'.

Cadets who finished basic training last year were promoted as Senior cadets, and took up the responsibility and emerged as leaders.

CDT Sathwik Gadiyar was promoted to Senior Under Officer and CDT Aishwarya, CDT Sushma and CDT Shriharsha were promoted to Cadet Under Officers. CDT Soumya and CDT Poornaraj were promoted to CQMS respectively.

The entire unit was divided into three companies to instil the sense of comradeship and to impart rigorous training, ALPHA company headed by CUO Aishwarya with 36 cadets, BRAVO company headed by CUO Sushma with 36 cadets and CHARLIE company headed by CUO Shriharsha with 36 cadets were formed.

On 15 August, 2018 Independence Day was celebrated with grandeur. Our college contingent bagged the first place in the district level March past competition held at Beedinagudde ground under the command of SUO Sathwik Gadiyar.

On 25 November, 2018 we celebrated NCC day. In this connection a voluntary blood donation camp was held at the government hospital Ajjarkad and donated 28 units of blood was donated. Cadets were divided into 2 teams, one team visited the oldage home 'vishranthidhama' at Manipal and distributed fruits and spent some memorable time with the inmates. The other team visited an orphanage in Kukkikatte and distributed fruits and biscuits to the inmates and conducted games and cultural activities for them.

On 26 January, 2019 Republic Day was celebrated with the Flag hoisting ceremony in the college and our college contingent participated and won the 2<sup>nd</sup> place in district level march past competition held at Beedingudde Ground under the command of SCUO Sathwik Gadiyar.

#### CAMPS ATTENDED:

On 4 July, 2018 three cadets participated in Thal Sainik launching Camp held at MIT Manipal. Cadet Abhiman made it to the Inter Group Competition in Bangalore and Cadet Swaroopa made it to the Pre TSC-1 in Bengaluru.

On 28 September, 2018 nine cadets participated in the Republic Day launching camp and Cadet Vivek made it till Pre-IGC at Alva's College Moodubidri.

Two Annual Training Camps were held at Alva's College Moodubidri from 28-09-2018 to 07-10-2018 and from 08-10-2018 to 17-10-2018, 58 cadets attended these camps.

Cadet Vivek attended the EBSB Camp at Ranibagh, Uttarakhand. Cadet Manjunath attended EBSB Camp at Jaisalmer, Rajasthan. Ek Bharath Shrest Bharath Camp was held in Uttarakhand and two of our cadets attended it. Ten cadets attended the All India trekking camp held in Tirupathi.

From 23 January, 2019 to 26 January, 2019 twenty-five cadets attended the Annual leadership Camp in Alva's college and participated in various competitions.

# SOCIAL WORK AND OTHER ACTIVITIES:

On 21 July, 2018, thirty two cadets participated in the International Yoga day celebrations at Malpe beach where cadets took part in synchronous yoga positions.

On 21 August, 2018 a Swatch Bharath Rally was organised in which 94 cadets actively participated in cleaning the surrounding areas of the College campus.

On 15 September, 2018 Twenty eight cadets participated in the International Coastal Cleanup Day held at Malpe beach.
